Presentation Papua New Guinea

If you were at our March 15th AAUW meeting, you were treated to an educational presentation by our own AAUW member, Pat Paul. Pat talked to us about the colonial heritage and the future possibilities for this country, Papua New Guinea. She shared her own impressions gained from living there and working with high school students.

Pat discussed several books that she had read that provided a nice explanation of the area and the times: <u>Euphoria</u> by Lilly King, "Inspired by events in the life of revolutionary anthropologist Margaret Mead". <u>Mr. Pip</u> by Lloyd Jones, "A story that celebrates the resilience of the human spirit and the power of narrative to transform our lives". <u>Lost in Shangri-La</u> by Mitchell Zuckoff, "...untold story of an extraordinary WWII rescue mission where a plane crash in the South Pacific plunged a trio of U.S. military personnel into a land that time forgot." Savage Harvest: "A Tale of Cannibals, Colonialism, and Michael Rockefeller's tragic quest for primitive art." by Carl Hoffman.
