PUBLIC POLICY UPDATE via Diane Norten, VP-Public Policy Chair

The Colorado Legislative session opens on Wednesday, January 12. I recently listened to a presentation, sponsored by the Colorado Sun, which featured two representatives from the Democratic party, two from the Republican party and Governor Polis. Their agendas for the upcoming session contained some similarities and some differences which included fee relief, affordability for residents, K-12 education, crime reduction, health and safety and women's rights. It will be interesting to see which bills are introduced. You can follow legislative proceedings by searching for Colorado General Assembly in your browser and choosing the official site: leg.colorado.gov. The Status Sheet on the site lists all bills introduced and their path through the legislative process.

AAUW will present the bills supported at Public Policy Day on Feb. 5.

Public Policy Day is such an important day as it gives us updates on what is happening in the legislature and which issues Colorado AAUW is supporting. It takes the place of our February meeting and I urge you to attend via ZOOM. It would be wonderful to have watch parties together on that day. Editor's Choice: <u>HAVE YOU SEEN LUIS VELEZ?</u> by Catherine Ryan Hyde; Story of two strangers who find that kindness is a powerful antidote to fear. Raymond Jaffe (17) feels like he doesn't belong. Not with his mother's new family. Not as a weekend guest with his father and his father's wife. Not at school, where he's an outcast. After his best friend moves away, Raymond has only two real connections: to the feral cat he's tamed and to a blind ninety-twoyear-old woman in his building who's introduced herself with a curious question: Have you seen Luis Velez?
