After the meeting, members are asked to help prepare items for the Girl Power event. With all of us, it won't take long.




Our November Meeting:

AAUW Public Policy Committee Report to the Fall Leadership Conference

2023 Action Priorities

- 1) To support a strong system of public education that promotes gender fairness, equity, diversity and inclusivity, and to address the barriers and implicit biases that hinder the advancement of women and girls.
- 2) To achieve economic security for all women.

Let's Look At the 2023 Colorado Legislative Session Review AAUW Scores on the Scorecard:

AAUW Actively Supported -- 44 Bills

- 12 Pay Equity/Economic Empowerment *7 Gun Safety
- 5 K-12 Education/Teachers *5 Reproductive Health
- 3 Behavioral Health *2 Title IX/Harassment
- 37 passed and were signed by the Governor
 - 5 were Pl'd (killed)
 - 2 died on the calendar

33 passed and were signed by the Governor


TREASURER'S REPORT via Deb Swiecinski, Treasurer

The checking account balance is \$8,099.47.

Forty-three (43) members have registered for the 2023-2024 year contributing \$473 in membership dues and \$2,214 in scholarship funds to the upcoming year's budget.

The 2023-2024 Budget was approved by the Board. In addition to operational funds for liability insurance, web site, and other miscellaneous administrative expenses, it includes \$1,000 set aside for the Girl Power Event on November 11th, \$500 for programs and speakers, and \$2000 for the ACC Foundation scholarship.

Also, I want to remind everyone that if you do not already participate in the Safeway or King Soopers fundraisers, please contact Marcia Miller to sign up. It's a great way for us to earn extra income for our projects. We earned \$582.70 from Safeway and \$968.31 from King Soopers this past year.


Morning Group: September will be time to review our summer reads.





Biography for Dr. Mom

Our guest speaker for our October 18 meeting will be our own Douglas County resident, Marianne Neifert, MD, MTS. Over nearly five decades, Dr. Neifert has educated health professionals on breastfeeding and lactation management throughout Colorado and in all 50 states. In 1985, she co-founded the first US model of comprehensive lactation care, which served as a prototype for optimal in-patient and out-patient breastfeeding services. Her enduring efforts have helped to elevate breastfeeding from a woman's "personal choice" to a public health priority warranting society-wide support.

Also known as Dr. Mom®, Marianne gave birth to five children between 1968 and 1975 while completing her medical training, making her an inspiring female physician pathfinder and role model prior to the influx of women into medicine. She has shared empowering positive parenting strategies through her five books, hundreds of magazine articles, frequent media appearances, and positive parenting presentations. Marianne is the proud grandmother of 7 grandchildren between 12 and 20 years.

A woman of deep faith, Marianne returned to school in midlife to earn a Master of Theological Studies at Iliff School of Theology. She was recently honored as Programs Volunteer of the Year at Douglas County Detention Center where she teaches Life Skills and Positive Parenting classes and leads Religious Services among female inmates.

Criteria Info for our Scholarship Program


Last spring, we decided to pursue a partnership with Arapahoe Community College for the administration of our AAUW Scholarship. This collaboration allowed for a much more diverse base of potential scholarship applicants. As ACC has expanded its reach into Castle Rock and Douglas County, our purpose is to support an ACC student to continue her/his pursuit of a post-secondary degree. We decided to fund this initial scholarship with \$2,000 with the option of continuing that funding to the recipient or selecting another greater amount or an additional recipient the following year. We agreed to continue our collaboration with ACC for 3-5 years unless there was an unforeseen change in our branch's funding source.

Specific criteria were developed to ensure a high quality of applicants for this scholarship. The criteria includes: -a 2.5 GPA or greater, -be degree seeking and carry at least 12 credits, -write a short essay on their career goals and how a scholarship will help achieve those goals, -demonstrate community involvement, -be a resident of Douglas County OR be enrolled in classes at ACC Sturm Collaborative Campus, -provide a letter of recommendation from a teacher or community member.

Selection Process: Applications were reviewed by two ACC Review committee members and one AAUW member (currently Kendra O'Hayre). ACC Scholarship and Financial Aid staff follow up on checking for compliance with all criteria and release funds to the verified recipient after drop class date is passed.

Our ACC Scholarship contact is Travis Ogburn who has been very responsive to our ongoing questions throughout the year. We are now ready to award our DC AAUW Scholarship on September 20. We have asked the recipient's to attend our September 20th Awards meeting so our membership will hear about her educational and career goals. The young woman, who received a top score by all the reviewers, has an impressive history and ambitious career goals.

While it has taken a year to develop the structure and details of our collaboration for this scholarship, I believe it provides an excellent framework for supporting needy and deserving post-secondary students.
